Chris's Messy Thoughts

Have you ever had the horrible feeling of finding out that you were wrong about something you had been sure you were right about? Messy Church this month is based on a story Jesus told that contains a message to us all, and one of the characters was heading towards such a realisation.

The story tells of two people praying at the Temple. One seems to be pure, perfect and good. Convinced he is better than the 'wicked' people around him, he uses his prayers to let them, and God, know it. The other person knows he has done many things wrong and not lived as God would like. He barely feels he has the right to pray and can only bow down before God and ask for forgiveness. Jesus surprises his audience by saying it is the second person who has a better relationship with God.

The story ends with one character leaving the Temple sadly unaware of his failings, and the other leaving in the hope that God loves him in spite of all his imperfections. This message is good news to us all! In reality, none of us are perfect and our only hope for a good relationship with God is through his loving acceptance and forgiveness of us. That is something we call God's Grace and Jesus has shown God offers it to us all. 
MeSSY M8's = Sue Tunbridge



Money Matters?

- Got a pocketful of change? Shopkeepers are legally allowed to refuse to accept payment for items if you try to give them too much small change. If they want to, they can refuse to accept more than 20p
- in 1p and 2p coins, more than £5 in 5p and 1op coins and more than £10 in 20p and £50p Coins
 - * The first coins were minted (made) around 2500 years ago.
 - Paper money was first used in China over 1000 years ago.
 - The benefit of metal coins is that they are portable and durable.
 - The original value of a British pound was equal to a pound (in weight) of silver.

removed and a wheelchair lift installed to the right of the doors.


